We stood motionless. We were far enough away that I was certain we would not be noticed. But immediately President Monson looked up from down the hallway and motioned for us to come to them. We obeyed!!!

As we approached, President Monson with a huge smile and the warmth of summer sun, exclaimed, "Well who do we have here?" He then greeted each of us and treated these young men as if they were dignitaries. He asked about each

one. He learned we were from Ohio and jokingly confided that he was a Michigan fan growing up. He commented that my son looked like himself growing up ... 6 feet 3 and 140 pounds. He made each of us feel special. And then they were off, on their busy schedule to do the Lord's work.

In that moment, I learned as much as I have from any conference talk. I felt and experienced firsthand the abundant love a Prophet has for God and his children. How blessed we are to be led and guided by a prophet of God. How blessed we are to have such an example to follow. Follow the prophet. Follow the prophet. He knows the way!
